- * DVT stands for deep vein thrombosis. DVT is a blood clot in the deep veins, usually in the leg.
- * According to the American Heart Assoc., DVT occurs in about 2 million Americans every year.¹
- * If a DVT breaks loose and travels to the lungs, it is called a pulmonary embolus (PE).
- * PEs can be immediately fatal and are responsible for about 300,000 deaths in the U.S. each year more than breast cancer and AIDS combined.^{2,3}
